Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel', which means, 'God is with us.' (Matthew 1:23)

As we approach this Christmas season, I am acutely aware of the distressing news of conflict coming from the Holy Land of Jesus' birth. I recall my own experience of visiting Bethlehem a few years ago and crossing the borders between there and neighbouring Jerusalem, passing through the dividing wall between Palestine and Israel. These scenes of division, violence, and humanitarian crisis are distressing, and all the more so at this special time of year.

Yet, this is also the context into which Jesus was born. At that time Bethlehem was a city under Roman occupation, with soldiers on the streets and regular conflict between the differing factions. Within the first years of Jesus' life, Herod, the puppet king appointed by the Romans, ordered the massacre of all baby boys. Mary and Joseph fled with the infant Jesus across the border to Egypt, desperate to save their child, they became refugees, seeking asylum, in a neighbouring land. A scene so familiar to us as we watch the news reports today.

But as the Bible, (both Old and New Testament), reminds us Jesus was to be called "Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us.'" Our Christmas celebrations of the birth of Jesus Christ remind us that God came to our world as an infant in a stable to be "God with us". God comes to be right here in the midst of all the complexity, horror and distress of the world. Jesus comes to share in our humanity and to experience our suffering.

Every year on Christmas day we read from the Gospel of St John; "in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." Christmas time reminds us that not only did Jesus come to be "God with us", but also to bring light and life to all people, a light that all the darkness of our broken world cannot overcome. We light the candles of our Advent Wreath to remind us that Jesus is the "light of the world". In the midst of darkness, the light of a single candle can be

If they have not acknowledged receipt of your representation before this date, please ring 020 7898 1784 or e-mail them to ensure it has been received. For administrative purposes, a petition will be classed as a single representation and the Commissioners will only correspond with the sender of the petition, if known, or otherwise the first signatory – "the primary petitioner".	
When making a representation, please also indicate the nature of your interest in the proposals (e.g. parishioner, member of parochial church council, etc) and whether you would like an opportunity to speak to the Committee regarding your representation if the Commissioners decide a hearing should be held regarding the case. If the Commissioners receive representations against the draft Scheme, they will send them, and any representations supporting the draft Scheme, to the Bishop whose views will be sought. Individual representors and the primary petitioner will then receive copies of the correspondence with the Bishop (including copies of all the representations) and will be told whether a hearing is to be held. They and individual petitioners may comment further to the Commissioners. Copies of all of the representations received and associated correspondence will be published on the Commissioners' website if the matter needs to be considered by the Commissioners.	
If a hearing is held, anyone may attend the meeting of the Mission and Pastoral Committee that considers the case and representors may have an opportunity to speak to the Committee. Otherwise the case will be considered in private.	
When the Commissioners acknowledge representations they will let individual representors (and the primary petitioner) know the next few dates of the Committee's

# Wolds Community First Responders Group



#### The following is a summary of the Wolds CFR Charitable Trusts Chairman's Report to the AGM.

It helps explain the important role that your CFRs perform for you to keep you safe.

First of all THANK YOU for donations towards the Wymeswold village Defibrillators.

The Wolds CFR scheme started just over 9 years ago in 2014.

We work on behalf of East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) and respond to 999 Category 1 & 2 calls directed to us by emergency phone.

We also respond to local calls for advice and support and often scale up local calls to emergency EMAS. We are also registered on the GoodSam 999 network for close-by Cardiac Arrests. We have responded to many of

these calls. We are proud to say that we have saved lives.

#### Volunteer staffing:

We currently have four trained CFRs and have trained and employed a total of 14 CFR volunteers over the past 9 years.

We have three level 3 CFRs (Peter, Howard and Will) one level 2 (Carla).

Our geographical area is a 5 mile radius from Wymeswold. However, level 3 CFRs get call outs to around 10 miles from time to time.

#### **CFR Training**

CFRs are trained by EMAS and there are different competency levels and also individual training on other aspects e.g. falls and Entonox etc.

EMAS keep us up to date with new medical skills and changes and new initiatives.

To continue to be operational CFRs have to pass a drugs test and a Basic Life Support (practical) test every year. **Recruitment**:

We are always recruiting although we don't have anyone going through training at the moment.

We currently have vacancies.

#### Funding:

All our funding comes mainly from Wymeswold donations and bequests and a small amount from public training donations.

We do not receive any funding from the outlying villages that we cover but that is down to our own PR activity. **Hours and Calls:** 

Since 2014 we have volunteered 8,890 Hours, averaging 1,110 hours per year

Since 2014 we have attended 1,336 - 999 emergency calls, averaging **167 calls per year**. (Excluding Covid and breaks). **CFR Car**:

We have the privilege of having been donated a car which is liveried as the EMAS Community First Responder car. We also use our own cars. It is likely that the current car may not last so we will soon be considering some sort of sponsorship arrangement.

EMAS do offer liveried CFR cars but these are on lease. Funding for an EMAS car is being considered

Local CPR (heart start) training and Defibrillator familiarisation training:

EMAS expect the local CFR groups to provide local CPR training.

We regularly provide CPR training to local schools, organisations and open drop in training.

We have trained over 250 people in 2023 to date.

Local Public (Wymeswold) AEDs

We maintain and manage three Defibrillators in the village of Wymeswold.

These have recently been renewed, after ten years, from local donations and current finances and all the CFR and villages AEDs are compatible to allow flexible use between the Group and public access AEDs. **The Future:** 

We need to recruit two more local CFRs. We need regular funding for an EMAS CFR car. Thank you for your support

knowledge and experience, and will be a great asset to the team.

**Biodiversity and Landscaping:** We would like to extend our gratitude to the Garden Walkabout Committee for their kind grant enabling us to plant more bulbs in the village.

**1**<sup>st</sup> **Wolds Scouts:** Huge thanks to the Scouts who have cleaned all the street signs in October as part of their community badge.

Leicestershire County Council (LCC) Members Highway Fund: Thank you to Councillor Richard Shepherd and LCC for their efforts in securing funds for a replacement Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) on East Road which was fitted this month.

Wymeswold Sports Pavilion and Sports Field is a community resource and is available for events subject to availability. Please contact the Clerk for more details if interested.

#### Forthcoming Temporary Traffic Restriction Orders:

A46 Lifecycle Extension Work (LEW) scheme between Six Hills and Widmerpool - Work is due to start on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2023 and is scheduled for completion by the end of March 2024.

Zouch Road, Hathern – to allow LCC to undertake urgent patching works on the bridge. The temporary road closure will be either side of Zouch Bridge for **1 day 9am-3pm** on **23<sup>rd</sup> November 2023.** 

- Wysall Lane, Wymeswold to allow LCC to safely undertake carriageway patching works. This will incorporate a temporary road closure. The duration of the restriction is not anticipated to exceed a period of **1 day** commencing on the **30<sup>th</sup> November 2023**.
- Clay Street, Wymeswold to allow LCC to safely undertake lamp column replacement works. This will incorporate a temporary road closure and temporary prohibition of waiting and loading at any time restriction. The duration of the restriction is not anticipated to exceed a period of **1 day** commencing on the **30**<sup>th</sup> **November 2023**.



The crown of several trees near the car park entrance to the Plantation were lifted, ferns planted, two young oaks and a wild cherry transplanted.



# GREEN ISSUES IN CHARNWOOD

The Government has just announced plans to lay a subsea cable to power British homes using Moroccan wind & solar energy. The XLinks solar & wind farm in the Sahara would provide 8% of UK energy needs supplying 7 million homes with reliable daily energy. This is a project of "national significance" and will reduce our dependence on fossil fuels from war torn countries. We will be emulating this in Charnwood on a much smaller scale with our neighbouring partners.

As such a climate emergency has just been declared by Charnwood Borough Council. The motion was unanimously passed at a council meeting on November 6 and it commits the Council to working with partners and communities to reduce carbon emissions and help limit global warming. The Borough Council will be using that declaration to continue to build on its current climate change strategy. The Council will also accelerate work with partners across the county and region to develop and implement best practice methods that can deliver carbon reductions and help limit global warming.

As you know The Wolds leads the Borough in the generation of Renewable Energy with four solar farms in the ward (with another on the way), solar panels on community buildings and scattered wind farms or singular masts. The solar farm on Wymeswold Airfield was the largest in the UK when it was installed 10 years ago and produces six times the energy we consume in The Wolds villages by powering 8000 homes, so we are in carbon credit not just net zero.

The Council has already taken steps to reduce its impact on the environment. Since 2018, the Council has reduced net carbon emissions related to its operations by over 30 tonnes. It has also planted 14,000 trees at Hathern , introduced more electric vehicles to its fleet and is using more renewable electricity. All new housing developments in the Borough have to provide even more green spaces, tree planting and where possible, integrated solar roof panels and is working towards decarbonising its own housing stock. It is currently installing electric vehicle charging points in Sileby and Anstey council car parks and has worked with other councils to help homeowners save money on solar panels. There are also many more commercial EV points springing up across Loughborough eg Shell garage on Belton Road, the Golf Range at Dishley & McDonalds.



# County Council News

#### Stubbing out smoking

Leicestershire has the lowest rate of smoking by adults in the East Midlands. New figures show that just 9.4 per cent smoke, compared with 11.2 per cent in 2021. The County Council's Quit Ready service has helped over 11, 000 people to stop smoking for good since 2017 and is on hand to offer support for anyone ready to stop smoking by means of tailored programmes. Quit Ready advisors provide a free and confidential 12-week programme. People are shown to be three times more likely to stop smoking if they have support from an advisor. That help, together with the use of e-cigarettes and vapes, can help smokers reach the important 28-day milestone by when they are five times more likely to quit for good.

Plans are being drawn up to expand the service following the announcement that the Government is proposing to give the Council £660,000 – doubling its budget – to increase support, target key groups and focus on vaping in young people. It is expected that the Council will receive this Government grant by next April.

#### Fostering

The final in-person event of the year at which residents can find out more about how they can help has now taken place. However, it is still possible to register for a forthcoming virtual event, to be held in the evening of Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> December, by completing the "Join a fostering event" form.

#### Mental health

The County Council's Mental Health Friendly Places scheme, which was launched in September, has already been joined by more than 15 organizations, including both businesses and charities. The training offered will help people in any organization recognize the signs and symptoms of poor mental health, have healthy conversations and signpost to local mental health and wellbeing services. The initiative is funded by NHS England and is in partnership with Leicester City Council and Rutland County Council.

Leicestershire residents can also learn more about mental health and suicide prevention through a Start a Conversation online course. Anyone who is interested in finding out about Start a Conversation, is looking for support concerning their own mental health, or would like to register their own organization to become a mental health friendly place, is asked to visit the Start a Conversation webpage.

However, if you are worried about your own immediate health and safety, or that of anyone else, the advice is to contact 999. Worldwide, 1 in every 100 deaths is the result of suicide.


