#### Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

As we enter December and the year draws to a close, we find ourselves once again at the threshold of Advent—a season that invites us to slow down, to wait, and to watch with expectation. The nights are long, the air carries a chill, and yet there is a quiet beauty to these days. Amid the darkness, candles are lit one by one, and with each small flame, our hope grows brighter. Advent is a time of promise: a reminder that even in the shadowed places of our world and our hearts, God's light is drawing near.

In many ways, our world feels full of waiting—waiting for peace, for healing, for reconciliation, for a sense of stability and hope. The message of Advent speaks directly into that longing. It tells us that God has not forgotten us, that He comes to dwell among us, not as a distant figure, but as Emmanuel—God with us. It is a truth that changes everything, if only we allow it to take root in us.

The Christmas story, though familiar, remains astonishing. God chooses to come among us, not with splendour or might, but in simplicity and vulnerability: a child born in a stable, laid in a manger, surrounded by ordinary people. Shepherds and angels, travellers and innkeepers—all are drawn into the story. In that moment, heaven touches earth. And through that child, the light of God's love begins to shine into every corner of human life.

As we prepare once more to celebrate the birth of Christ, I encourage you to take time to notice the signs of God's presence among us. We may glimpse Him in the kindness of a neighbour, in a shared meal, in the laughter of children, or in a moment of quiet prayer. The same God who came to Mary and Joseph still comes to us today, often in unexpected ways.

In the midst of the season's busyness—shopping, cooking, wrapping, travelling—try to find a few moments each day simply to stop and breathe. Light a candle, read a verse of Scripture, say a prayer of thanks. These small acts of stillness are ways of preparing a place for Christ to be born again in our hearts.

I want to thank you all for your faithfulness through the past

#### Heritage Project Wymeswold Family Discoveries

Over the last five months, St Mary's Church heritage project has organised several events to help people research their family histories. In September and October, the Leicestershire and Rutland Family History Society ran two workshops for us on how to research family history.



They gave presentations, on researching family ancestors and on house histories, all illustrated with examples from Wymeswold. We also had lots of hands-on research time, aided by experts from the Society.

Three outcomes really stand out. First, how addictive family research can be – once a family member is found in the records discovering more about them is compulsive. Second, family history is full of surprises; one of our group members discovered the existence of two uncles he had known nothing about. Third, how moving it can be. The most memorable find was by Chris Kirk, who found a beautiful photograph of his grandmother, which he had never seen before. Our appreciation goes to the National Lottery Heritage Fund, whose grant has allowed us to organise these, and a range of forthcoming, activities.

#### News from Wymeswold St Mary's

Christmas is nearly here but before I turn to details of St Mary's plans for Christmas, I want to mention three past events

First, the village Remembrance Service held on 9 November. There are so many people to thank but a special thank you to Peter Blount for reorganising this service so promptly and with his usual efficiency when St Mary's was still under wraps, enabling the village to come together as it always does to remember all those, especially from Wymeswold, who gave their lives in war.

Secondly, many thanks to the members of the Rutland Family History Society who led a Workshop on 27 October. They dealt with questions on families, places, houses etc both generally and with family histories of those attending. It was absolutely fascinating as well as helpful to anyone looking at their family history.

Thirdly, thank you to all those who organised the Wymeswold School Stained Glass Exhibition. Most of all though, a huge thank you to all the children whose beautiful work was exhibited – a lot of talented young people.

Our first Heritage event in December, at 1.45pm on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> is a lecture by Richard Ellison on The Stones of St Mary, beginning with a short tour round the church. This looks to be very interesting. *Full details can be found on the poster further on in the Link*.

The second is also on 6 December, at 7.30pm when the well-known local Global Harmony Community Choir (not a gospel choir as said in error in last month's Link) will be holding a concert of Traditional Carols and Songs from around the world in the church. *Full details, including ticket prices, can be found on their poster further on in the Link.* 

Moving forwards, **St Mary's annual Mince Pie Morning takes place on Saturday 13 between 10am and 12 noon,** when we welcome the arrival of the Christmas tree into the church and decorate it while we enjoy mince pies and mulled wine. This year, in addition, there is a Free Christmas Tree Decorations Workshop for Adults and Children.

The following evening, **December 14**, **at 6pm there is the Carol Service**, with traditional readings and congregational carols led by the choir. Refreshments will be served after the service.

Our Crib Service will be held on Christmas Eve at 4pm, always one of the highlights of Christmas, a wonderful service with whole families attending with their little ones and a wonderful air of excitement and anticipation. ## FUNDRAISING FOR THE REPAIR OF THE TOWER ROOF.

Prestwold. The church belongs to The Church of England so we can call it "OUR CHURCH". There is a general assumption that this church is part of the Prestwold Hall Estate which is not so.

If you haven't been before, the church is a beautiful, little historical Parish church with a BIG PROBLEM in that the Tower roof urgently needs replacing. An initial amount of money needs to be raised by us before we can apply for grants which we intend to do – However, before we apply for the majority of the grants, we need to be seen to have collected a reasonable sum - in our case we estimate that to be another £10.000.

I am asking you please if you can help us to raise this initial sum by making a donation. I realise that in this country and, it appears all over the world, there is extreme financial pressure at the moment but we are not asking for hundreds (unless you have it spare!) - anything you can manage would be greatly appreciated. We also have an "easy fundraising account" whereby every time you shop online, a

#### Councillor resignation

After many years of dedicated service, Adrian Cooke has unfortunately decided that the time has come to step down from the Parish Council. Adrian played a key role in pushing for the pedestrian crossing on the main road, and did a phenomenal amount of work in terms of landscaping and biodiversity. He has spent many, many hours organising and planting trees and bulbs around the village. We will miss him at meetings, and offer heartfelt thanks for all his hard work over the years.

#### **Councillor vacancy**

At the time of writing, a Notice of Vacancy has been published, allowing 10 or more electors the chance to request an election from Charnwood Borough Council to fill the current vacancy on the Council. If no such request is made, the Council can move to co-opt a candidate. We expect to do this at our January meeting. Our Co-option Policy, detailing who can apply and how to do so, can be found on our website. Anyone interested in joining the Council is asked to contact the Clerk to find out more. We meet at 7pm on the first Monday of most months.

#### New village website

This will cover all aspects of village life except the Parish Council, and has been made possible thanks to the generous National Lottery Heritage Fund grant given to St Mary's Church. A huge thank you to Janet Thomas and Liz Tingle who have worked so hard to get the new website up and running, and to Janet for supporting the Parish Council page on the old website for many years.

#### Wymeswold Flood Warden Group

As you may have seen, we decided to set up a Flood Warden Group for our village after the flooding that occurred in Jan 2025. There are currently three wardens in place - myself (Steve Morris) along with Jeff Weston and Francesca Pearce.

Although we are still awaiting formal training from the County Council - which has been cancelled three times since May - we are still making progress towards some of our goals to hopefully ensure we as a community are better prepared next time flooding occurs.

Leaflets have been posted through over 100 doors on Brook Street over the last few weeks to gain more insight into properties that have flooded previously and also to identify householders who consider themselves to be at risk of flooding in the future.

We also asked residents if they wanted to be notified by text or an automated phone call if the water level in the brook reaches certain levels. There has been a good response to this with over 60 people registering so hopefully we can all get a more accurate and timely notification of imminent flooding.

Please note that this service is free of charge and is not just limited to Brook Street residents. If you have an interest in signing up for this, please let me know - contact details below.

We are still pursuing having the ability to close sections of Brook Street in the event of flooding. This would hopefully be delegated to us from the Highways Dept at Leics County Council. Although the flooded road may be passable with care by HGVs, Tractors etc, these can cause considerable damage if not driven courteously as they can create a bow wave which can temporarily raise the height of the flood water considerably.

We have also applied for a grant from a scheme launched by Charnwood Borough Council which aims to distribute £150,000 across parishes affected by flooding. We are intending to use this grant to fund a flood locker to store road signs, traffic cones and any other things we'll need going forward.

Once we have a few more things in place, I will no doubt be asking for more volunteers to help us out as the necessity arises.

Although the group was instigated by the direct issue on Brook Street, we are intending to provide a service across the village to provide specific support in the event of any actual flooding events. One of our group - Jeff - is also the vice Chair of the Parish Council so if you have any issues or concerns regarding potential flooding risks caused by new developments in the village or proposed solar farms for example, please contact him using the email address below.
