Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

As I write this, I am sitting in my study looking out of the window at a day when the sun forgot to shine. The leaves on the trees are just about all fallen, and the garden is ready for its winter rest.

This has been a year of extremes in regards to the weather – the hottest summer ever recorded in Great Britain – loved by some, but not by all! September saw an excess of rain – much needed by gardens, reservoirs and farms, but not so welcome by those who work outdoors.

Although the summer is gone and the autumn is nearly over, we are coming to the start of our new church year. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. A time to sit back and take stock of our lives, of our hopes and dreams for the future, and to remember all the wonderful gifts the good Lord has given us.

I have a friend who has a poster hanging in her 'smallest room', for (presumably) moments of contemplation. It reads: "I believe in the sun even when it is not shining..." Although it is hard to believe, we know it is summer when the calendar tells us it is. It may not be the summer we want or remember having in the past but it is still summer. The grass grows (and grows), the flowers come out in their myriad of colour, the young birds fly the nest and there is a general buzz in the air. It is Summer.



Sunday 2 November 4pm, All Souls Service, St Mary's, Wymeswold This is a service of thanksgiving and remembrance as we think of those we have loved and who are no longer with us. During the service there will be an opportunity to light a candle and have the name of your loved ones read out or you can just sit quietly at this peaceful service. All are welcome.

News From St Andrew's Church

November is the time when most of us start to concentrate on what we are going to do to get ready for Christmas; who we are going to send cards to, who to buy presents for and how are going to celebrate this wonderful birthday. We may still wait for a couple of weeks before doing anything about it but at least we will be thinking about it so this is what I call our preparation month so this is going to be a report on what is happening at St Andrew's.

Our monthly afternoon teas held at Burton-on-the-Wolds are still proving to be well supported, and the dates for these teas during the winter period are 11th November, 9th December, 13th January, 17th February, 10th March, again from 2.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. at the Burton-on-the-Wolds Village Hall.

As I said in my October report, people of all ages are most welcome, even if it is just for a quick hello and a cuppa before collecting the children from school. Please come. The church will be open on the afternoon of the **Sunday**, 9th **November** as Prestwold is having a Wedding Fayre so if you are in the area please pop in, have a look round and maybe have a cup of tea. We take advantage of these days as with the location of the church it is difficult to leave it open at all times.

We are participating in the **Christmas Gift and Craft Fair** at Prestwold Hall on **the Saturday 15**th and **Sunday 16**th **November from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.** and will be running the raffle. Last year this went very well so we are hoping for similar success this year.

On the 7th December we will be holding the St Andrew's Christmas Craft Fair at the Hoton Village Hall. Last year this proved to be a very enjoyable day.

Now - FUNDRAISING FOR THE REPAIR OF THE TOWER ROOF.

St. Andrew's is nestled in between spinneys in the beautiful grounds of the Prestwold Estate and is the Parish Church for people living in the villages of Hoton, Burton-on-the-Wolds, Cotes and Prestwold. The church belongs to The Church of England so we can call it "OUR CHURCH". There is a general assumption that this church is part of the Prestwold Hall Estate which is not so.

If you haven't been before, the church is a beautiful, little historical Parish church with a BIG PROBLEM in that the Tower roof urgently needs replacing. An initial amount of money needs to be raised by us before we can apply for grants which we intend to do – However, before we apply for the majority of the grants, we need to be seen to have collected a reasonable sum - in our case we estimate that to be another £10,000.

I am asking you please if you can help us to raise this initial sum by making a donation. I realise that in this country and, it appears all over the world, there is extreme financial pressure at the moment but we are not asking for hundreds (unless you have it spare!) - anything you can manage would be greatly appreciated.



New Vice Chair

Councillor Jeff Weston was unanimously elected as the new Vice Chair of the parish Council for the remainder of 2025-26. Councillor Laura Mills continues as Chair. As well as being a parish councillor, Jeff is also one of our village flood wardens.



PLANTATION AT TOWLES FIELD NEEDS YOUR HELP

The Parish Council owned Plantation at Towles Field is required to have an independent tree inspection every 3 years in order to make sure it is a safe environment for all that use it, for dog walking, exploring, forest school or just taking a nice walk through the woodland. The tree inspection reported that a large number of diseased or dying trees will need to be felled over the next 12 months. Ideally this needs to happen before the end of February 2026 to avoid bird nesting season.

In order to keep the Plantation open, Burton on the Wolds, Cotes and Prestwold Parish Council need your help to raise some funding which will assist covering some of the cost of the essential felling.

Have you been to the Hoton Recreation ground lately and seen the lovely new raised beds.

Hoton Parish Council commissioned these for replacement as the previous ones were falling to pieces. Don't they look lovely? What a great addition to the area.

Lease of the Hoton Recreation Ground

Hoton Parish Council lease the recreation ground land from Charnwood Borough Council. The lease runs on a 25-year cycle. The current 25-year lease is now due for renewal. Up until now Hoton Parish Council have only been required to pay a peppercorn rate of £1 per year. However, Charnwood Borough Council have confirmed that they are no longer able to offer peppercorn rates and that 'any lease renewal will need to be based on an assessment of rental value determined by a Chartered Surveyor. The use of the land including other factors such as benefits to the local community would be factored in when making the determination'.



As we are sure you can appreciate the Parish Council may not be in a position to be able to cover the cost of what the rental increment could be and we await further information from Charnwood Borough Council. If we are to continue to lease the recreation ground, the new rental cost will have to be incorporated in the 2026/2027 budget.




